- › 1967: Designed Washburn College Bible



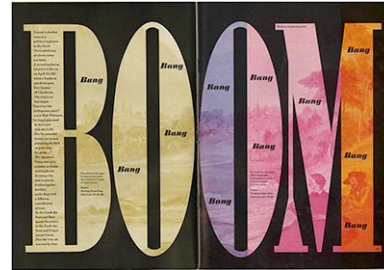

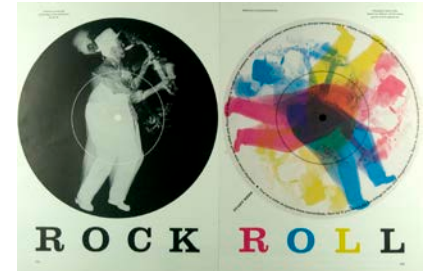

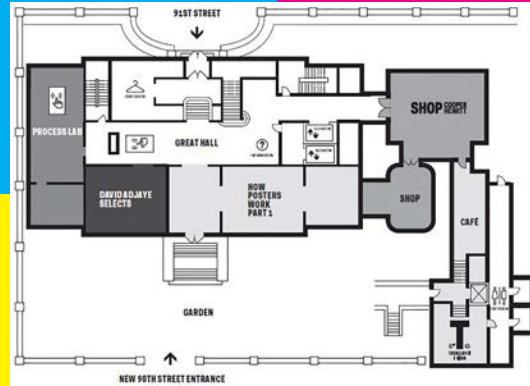
